M.P.H.Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Malegoan Camp owes its existence to the inspiration, pioneering work and farsightedness of its founder member, Hon'ble Late Karmaveer Bhausaheb Hiray, a staunch freedom fighter, one of the pioneers in forming of Maharashtra State and Co-operative movement in Nashik District, an Educationist, an Ex-Revenue Minister of then Bombay Province,. He has founded the two well known Institutions "Adivasi Seva Samiti" in 1945 and "Mahatma Gandhi Vidyamandir" in 1952. The major objective of these Institutions was to provide the educational opportunities. It gave great boost to all the students in the North Maharashtra to achieve higher educational goals.

The devotional motto of the Institute is "Bahujan Hitaya Bahujan Sukhay". The institute has been registered under Societies Registration Act 1860. (No.2766 of 1951-52 dated 21-2-1952) and Bombay Public Trust Act 1950 (No.- F-27 dated 23-8-1954)

After the sad demise of Karmaveer Bahusaheb Hiray, on 6th November 1961, his elder son Loknete Vyankatrao Hiray took over the responsibilities of the Institution. Under his efforts and guidance, M.G. Vidyamandir started other colleges imparting higher education in the faculty of Arts, Commerce, Science, Law, Pharmacy and Education at Malegaon and later on at Manmad, Yeola, Nashik and Nampur.

After his unfortunate and untimely demise in the year 1980, his wife Mahilaratna Pushpatai Hiray devoted her services for continuing the work. The institution opened new colleges at Harsul and Surgana the remote tribal areas and a women's college at Malegaon, and a college at Saundane, later shifted to Nimgaon.

Today M.G. Vidyamandir is progressing under the able leadership of General Secretory, Hon'ble Shri. Prashantdada Hiray, Former Minister of State for Transport and President of Marketing Federation of Maharashtra Mumbai. He has also



established Professional Colleges such as Dental, Pharmacy, Institute of Hotel Management and Catering Technology, Institute of Management and Research (M.B.A.) Panchavati College of Management and Computer Science etc. to widen the scope of career selection and to satisfy the growing demands for. Professional course in Urban areas. His main aim is to enhance the quality of education in this era of competitive globalization through his dedicated efforts. Presently 87 educational units ranging from Primary to Post Graduate and from traditional education to current disciplines such as computer Management, Health Science, Agriculture, Pharmacy, Hotel Management etc. are managed by the Trust.

* College at a Glance *

Mahilaratna Pushpatai Hiray Arts, Science and Commerce Mahila Mahavidyalaya was established in June 1990. The college is affiliated to the Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune. The college got UGC recognition under section 2 (f) in 10 June 1990 and under section 12 (b) in July 2002.

The Colleges is situated in a campus of 23 acres in a semi urban area, There are 3 Faculties' i.e. Arts, Science and Commerce and Mental Moral and social science as a part of Arts faculty. The college provides education in 6 subjects under science, 09 subjects in Arts (04 subjects under Arts and 05 under Mental Moral and social sciences as a part of Arts faculty), and 04 under commerce faculty while Geography is offered under both Arts and Science faculties. 40 faculties 13 Non - teaching staff have been working at present: 22 Ph.D. Holder, 07 are M.Phil. 2 D. Litt. and 17 are NET/SET. There are 26 ladies teachers working at present out of 40, indicates clear-cut gender balance in the faculty.

The students aspiring to acquire a B.A. degree from the college have options of English, Marathi, Hindi, Music, Economics, History, Geography, Political science and Psychology as special subject from the second year, while Botany Chemistry Mathematics and Statistics, Physics, Zoology and Geography are the choices available for the students of science faculty and Accounting and Auditing, Costing, Business Administration, Banking and finance, marketing management are the area of specialization provided to the student of commerce faculty.

The College has provided an opportunity to cater the aspiring needs of the students by introducing PG courses in Histroy, Marathi, and Music. The MPH College is unanimous in holding Post Graduation in Music in Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune. The College publishes its Annual Magazine viz "Apoorva Sampada".

The organization of Annual Social Gathering, Seminars, Workshops, and Lecture Series helps in increasing the Quest of Excellence among the students.

Remedial Coaching Classes are organized for slow learners SC/ST/OBC and Minority by the Department of Mathematics and Statistics, Commerce, English and Economics. The department of English screens movies based on plays and texts as a best



practice. The college has NSS unit including 200 students volunteers in the extension activities to contribute for community development.

The college has central library along with a departmental library for Music. The central library has 20383 books including 7927 text books, 12456 Reference books, 291 encyclopedias etc. The library has subscribed 55 journals and provides open access to students and faculty.

The College has appointed lady Director of Physical Education for coaching the sports women of the college. It has a large play ground to inculcate sports among the students for outdoor and athletic games. The participation of sportswomen at intercollegiate, interzonal and inter university level indoor and outdoor games like cricket, Volley ball, korf ball, kabbaddi, chess, badminton, kho - kho, table tennis base ball etc. is appreciable The college has Gymkhana Facilities for women. The faculty of the College creates strong and healthy atmosphere for the academic and personal growth of the students, records good results at College and University ranks.

The College has conducted various programs like poetry recitation, Quiz contest, General Knowledge competition, data collection and analysis and Mahilaratna Pushpatai Hiray State Level Intercollegiate Singing Competition which inculcate and provide an opportunity to student for developing their talent and potentials in the diverse areas. The College has a strong Mechanism to measure the academic growth of the College. The Principal, Vice Principal, faculties in charges and the OS (Office Superintendent) check the efficiency of the teaching and administrative staff. The various extracurricular activities are conducted to support the students by inculcating the value system among them. The college has Students Grievances Redressal Cell, Vishakha Committee for solving problems of students and ladies staff.

* Fees *

FEES: Admission fees will be charged as per the University & Govt. of Maharashtra norms. Library & laboratory deposit will be refunded to students after she leave the college. The fees schedule of various faculties (i.e. Arts, Science, Commerce) for the academic year 2022-23 will be displayed on College Notice Board at the time of admission.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 1. Following documents are to be attached with the admission form
 - i) Mark-sheet with two true copies.
 - ii) A gap certificate-if there is a gap between the year of passing H.S.C. examination and the year of seeking admission to any of the first year courses.
 - iii) Original LC/TC with two true copies.
 - iv) Candidate coming from the states other Maharashtra is to submit a migration certificate.
 - v) Copies of recent passport size photograph along with candidate's name and class (for which the admission is sought) written on the back side of the photograph.
- 2. No admission shall be regarded as confirmed until all the essential documents are submitted and the prescribed fees paid.'
- 3. A candidate with the confirmed admission shall be considered enrolled for the whole academic year unless the candidate informs the Principal in writing of her intention to leave the college, at least a week before the commencement of the second term.
- 4. The admission remains valid for one academic year only. A candidate has to seek a fresh admission for each academic year.
- 5. Once the admission is confirmed no refund of fees will be made.



- 6. Students admitted to FYBA/B.Com./B.Sc. will have to undergo Medical check-up by the Medical authorities approved by the College. Students failing to do so will not be allowed to appear for Examination.
- 7. Admission to 'Grant-in-aid' and 'non-grant' division will take place strictly on merit basis as per Government directives.
- 8. All the students seeking admission to the First year [F.Y.B.A./ B. Com. / B. Sc.) shall have to apply in the prescribed form for the certificate of Eligibility as per Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune norms.
- 9. Candidate will not be allowed to choose English at special level if they have not opted for Optional English in FYBA.
- 10. Before seeking the admission in any class of the college students and parents are advised to go through the guidelines and the notices put up on the notice board pertaining the information regarding to the rules and regulations about the admission process.
- 11. Physical Education Examination is compulsory for First Year FYBA/B.Com./B.Sc. Students.
- 12. Admission cancel fee refund procedure Student have to apply for cancellation of admission and fee refund within 30 days.
 - within 1 to 10 days 20% amount will be less out of total fee paid.
 - within 11 to 20 days 40% amount will be less out of total fee paid.
 - within 21 to 30 days 60% amount will be less out of total fee paid. After 30 days no claim for refund.

 - iv) Choice Based credit System (70-30 Pattern) is applicable to all FYBA courses.

Rules and Regulations for Credit and Semester System w.e.f. Academic Year-2015-16

- II. Admission and Conduct of the Credit System
- 1. The M.A./M.Sc. degree will be awarded to students who complete a total of 64 credits (Social Sciences and Humanities) and 100 credits (Sciences) in a minimum of two years for completing on an average 16 credits per semester (Social Sciences and Humanities) and on an average 25 credits per semester (Sciences). Except Practical credits wherever applicable, students may be allowed to complete less courses per semester on a condition they complete the degree in a maximum of four years. This facility will be available subject to the availability of concerned courses in a given semester and with a maximum variation of 25 per cent credits (in case of fresh credits) Per semester.
- 2. A student may offer courses equivalent to 25 percent

- credits during each semester from any other department than the. one where / she is registered (subject to Rule 11.8. C. below). In case a student wishes to take all courses from the parent department she can also do so.
- **3.** Each credit will be equivalent to 15 hours.
- 4. The department can announce seminar courses to introduce students to research done by the faculty. Seminar credits are to be conducted through discussion and presentation by the student and the personal guidance of the teacher. Seminars shall not exceed maximum of 2 credits.
- **5.** Each department should decide the minimum eligibility for all the credits as well as for seminar credits.
- **6.** The Departmental Committee consisting of all teachers in the department a. will nominate the faculty for each course to be taught in the



department.

b. will approve the plan for the evaluation prepared by the faculty for the credits concerned as internal continuous assessment of 50 percent from among the 9 given in the III. 11 below. Ordinarily the teacher may opt for an internal assessment procedure other than written exams;

c. will evolve the norms for evaluating oral examinations whenever necessary in relation to term paper/assignments;

d. will be the Board of Examination and will nominate the faculty concerned as the paper setter and examiner for the semester-end examination (5- percent component);

e. will decide eligibility norms for students from other departments offering courses at the department;

f. will identify the core credits that a student registered in the department must necessarily study to obtain a post graduate degree in that subject;

g. will announce at the commencement of each semester which credits are available to students from other departments;

h. will take appropriate decisions in the cases of readmissions of students during transition from Old to Revised syllabus by deciding which credits from the Revised syllabus are equivalent to credits from the Old syllabus:

i. will revise the syllabus at least every five years;

j. will nominate an examination comittee from among faculty members for every academic year where the total existing faculty strength is more than ten;

k. In departments where a Departmental Examination

Committee (DEC) exists under the Academic Flexibility Program, the DEC will continue to function as before. Regular Students can also audit for extra credits if the departmental committee agrees.

- 7. A student must at the commencement of the semester communicate which credits s/he is going to audit. Such Audited credits will be mentioned separately in the Grade sheet.
- **8.** Regular students can offer extra courses from their own department or from other departments. In such cases, students shall specify the Extra Credit and this will be so noted on their Grade sheets. However, the grades of the Extra credits shall NOT be counted for arriving at GPA.
- 9. University departments will also permit students to be admitted as casual students and enroll themselves for one to sixteen credits (Social Sciences and Humanities) and one to twenty credits (Sciences) Per semester.
- **10.** There will be no mid-way change over from credit system to non-credit or external examination or vice versa.

WHAT IS GRADE POINT?

The system of evaluation will be as follows: Each assignment/test will be evaluated in terms of grades. The grades for separate assignments and the final (semester-end) examination will be added together and then converted into for each semester and the final examination will give total grades and grade point average.

- 1) One book at a time will be issued against the issue card. A student is allowed to keep the book for seven days only. In case of failure to return the book in time the student will be fined for delay as per the rules.
- 2) Each student must always carry her Identity card and an Issue card with her.
- 3) The students have to follow the guidelines and instructions regarding to the transactions as displayed on the notice board from time to time. Necessary action will be taken in case of violation or non-observance of the instructions.
- 4) Students must see that they do not cause damage to the books in the library. They will be fined for damages.
- 5) Library deposit has to be paid at the time of admission. Deposit once paid at the time of admission will be retained upto the end of the final year of the student in the college. Deposit will be returned to the students if a student discontinues her education, cancels her admission or if she is debarred from the college. She should apply for refunding the deposit in the next year. If she fails to do so, her deposit stands forfeited.
- 6) Internet facility available for teachers and students.
- 7) Library provides computerized I-card and Issue card to each student and staff.

* Scholarship and Freeship *

- 1) E.B.C. Concession: A student is required to submit prescribed E.B.C. form in the office along with the admission form.
- 2) B.C. Scholarship; A number of scholarships and freeships to B.C. students. Students have to apply in a prescribed form only.

Various Scholarship offered and Eligibilities for it



- 1) National Merit Scholarship: Minimum 50 % marks in Annual Examination available up to graduation.
- 2) Open Merit State Government scholarship: As per Merit
- 3) State Government Merit Scholarship for rural students: As per Merit.
- 4) Primary and Secondary Teacher's wards Merit Scholarship: As per Merit.
- 5) Hindi Scholarship: For students having mother tongue other than Hindi and have passed in Hindi and passed in Hindi as a subject in the previous year examination.
- 6) Scholarship for physically Handicapped: Certificate of Handicap issued by the civil surgeon.
- 7) Merit Scholarship in Mathematics and Physics: Minimum 60% marks in mathematics and Physics
- 8) Scholarship on Merit and Income: Merit + Income of parents
- 9) Central Government Scholarship for SC/ST/NT students: Students belonging to Government notified: SC/ST/NT categories.
- 10) Rajarshi Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Scholarship: SC, NT and OBC students securing 75% marks or more are eligible for this scholarship.
- 11) Other Backward Class (OBC) scholarship: OBC students having OBC Caste certificate from competent authority and income of parents less than Rs.65000/- are eligible for this scholarship.
- 12) Minority Scholarship Scheme (Post-Matric Scholarship) as per Government of Maharashtra GR (542/07) the Scholarship is applicable for minority communities such as Muslim, Parsi, Shikh & Christian students. The students who are economically backward from these communities are entitled to get free education from 11* Std. to Ph.D. They must have obtained 50% of marks in the examination attended previously.
- 13) Savitribai Phule Financial Assistance Scheme: The girl students of the college, economically backward have been facilitated by Savitribai Phule financial Assistance.



Note: If a student getting scholarship fails in the examination, she/he is not eligible for the scholarship twice (while studying in the same class). Students eligible for the scholarship should collect application forms from the college office at the time of admission. The duly completed scholarship forms, accompanies from the college office documents must be submitted before given due date and the receipt of the same obtained from the college office should be maintained. No complaints, inquiries regarding the scholarship and fee concession will be entertained after 31 st March. For any difficultly connate the appropriate college authority from university of Pune.

- 1. Students will seek admission with the help of prescribed form of admission provided by the College only.
- 2. Students shall abide by the rules prescribed by the college authorities from time to time with regard to their conduct etc.
- 3. Every student must get her Identity card attested by the principal within 15 days of admission.
- 4. Students must always carry their Identity card within college premises and produce it whenever asked for.
- 5. Minimum 80% attendance in the classes is essential as per the directives of the university. EBC concession will be withdrawn if the attendance is less than that.
- 6. Regular attendance in the classes, tutorials, practical and internal tests is obligatory to the students Failing the regularity students may not be allowed to appear for the final examination. The Principal's decision is final in this regard.
- 7. Students must observe complete silence when they pass through the corridors. They should see that classes in progress are not disturbed by their behaviour.
- 8. Students should behave with the teachers and the office staff with due respect.
- 9. Students can approach the Principal in case of complaints or problems of any sort through proper channel i.e. through the concerned Head of the Department.
- 10. Students can arrange short, long excursion tours only with the permission of the Principal, in writing.
- 11. An attempt of manipulation in documents or otherwise will be treated as a serious offence. Students shall face severe action in such a case.
- 12. Students should take care that they do not cause damage of any kind to the college, building or any other property of the college. They will be penalized in such a case. Discipline comittee of the college shall take action against the student found guilty.
- 13. Principal's decision is final and binding in all matters related to college. The Principal can exercise her authority whenever required as per the university circular."
- 14. The Principal is the ultimate authority in the matters related to admission or denying the admission.
- 15. Students should go through the rules carefully before applying for the admission.
- 16. The Principal reserves the right to change or modify the rules as and when necessary.
