5. Student Mentoring:

The mentoring of students is an integral part of the college curriculum. Teachers are natural mentors of their students. M.P.H. Mahila College has a proper student mentoring system in place. In the beginning of each academic year, after the admission process is over, College is required to assign a teacher mentor to each student. In general, the number of students with each teacher mentor varies from 30 to 35 approximately according to the strength of teachers and students in college. Head of each department is assigned a mentor to final year students. The mentor is required to prepare a list of his/her mentee students and maintain the record of their information (mobile number, residential address, parents contact number etc) .Students are free to approach their teachers anytime if any issue is disturbing her routine, still, the system of mentor – mentee builds an extra confidence and sense of security among students. This whole system leads to a better connection between students and teachers and helps build a friendly and cordial relation between them. Students get a sense of protection because they know that they have someone to go to in case of any eventuality.






11. Performance Appraisal System:

15. Gender Equity and Women Empowerment activities




